

My dear friends

We all make plans but can only do it within the limits of what is possible. I can remember how in the 1990s in the Netherlands, companies and banks would make thirty-year plans. Then the world changed. It became more uncertain and twenty, ten and even five-year plans became more realistic. Last month I spoke personally and told you about my diagnosis of prostate cancer. You are family and I did not want to keep it a secret. Thank you for your support. This month I learned that it has not spread and is confined and treatable. This is good news and I am learning about treatment.

As I reflect on the experience, it feels like joining a club which some of you have been paid up members of for some time! Talking about it is essential. Whether our issues are about personal health, family relationships or the nation, talking to Jesus about them is a good thing to do. That's another way of saying that prayer is very important to our personal healing. The experience has also given me a new focus and awareness. Whenever it is, I will take the necessary time to be treated and recover properly. Before then, in July, I will be off for a couple of weeks as the far-flung family join us for the wedding of my son Daniel to Emilie in Glen Clova.

In terms of planning at the Steeple, your views are sought about a new way of governance and making decisions. Members of the Kirk Session and Congregational Board have agreed that a variety of 'teams' should plan and deliver on matters of the Steeple Church. They are worship, music, prayer, small groups, world mission, local mission, parish nursing, community engagement, Alpha, pastoral care, students, young people, social fellowship, finance, building management, hall marketing, data protection, catering and communications. They would operate under a single Kirk Session in what is known as the Church of Scotland's 'Unitary Constitution'.

You will have heard that we are creating a new 'Alpha' course at the 'Blend' Coffee shop. This will be really worth recommending to your friends and neighbours. We have already set up a new fellowship called 'Cafe nights.' We have also heard that we have 'Go For It' funding to employ our community engagement worker and build on the 'Open church' afternoons.

For some of you, this may be a time for visiting your family or taking a holiday. If you do visit other churches, be sure to bring our greetings and bring me back a leaflet or newsletter!

STEEPLE PEOPLE AUTUMN ALPHA COURSE BLEND COFFEE LOUNGE, REFORM STREET

For your radar and prayer: the **ALPHA TASTER (INTRODUCTION)** in Blend Coffee Lounge, Reform Street at 7.00 p.m. on **Tuesday 17th September**.

You are invited to come with a guest who you think might be open to exploring Jesus' wisdom on life and living at its best.

The evening will be free, low key, friendly and definitely not pushy or pressurising. Our guests will be fed, watered and invited to sample the introductory Alpha video called "Is there more to life than this?". If they think that the taste suits them they can then sign up for the whole course. It

will run each Tuesday night from 24th September until 10th December. (There will be an additional Saturday early in November to explore questions about the Holy Spirit.)

After the Taster event each evening will have food, a video presentation and then groups in which guests can just listen to the others or ask any question and share their thoughts. The presentations will cover questions like: Who is Jesus? Why did he die? How can I have faith? ... what about Prayer, Reading the Bible? How does God guide? Who is the Holy Spirit? How can I resist evil? What about the church? Does God heal today? and more.

Our aim is to provide Steeple People with an opportunity to be courageous and generous with sharing Jesus across the wider Dundee community.

This Alpha Course is led by (retired Rev) Jim Robertson who found in his past working life that through the Alpha Course Jesus' transforming love and power has a way of coming through for people in surprising ways.
